Kids Korner

JUNE 2021 (40 students)

- Summer programming is in full effect. Weekly field trips, learning zone and clubs for all our students enrolled at Kids Korner.
- Weekly swim trips to The Super Splash Park.
- Department of Child and Family Services (DCFS) is still requiring us to wear masks, keep the children in separate groups and continue to do temperature checks.
- U of I Extension has continued to work on the Kids Korner garden to ensure the best outcome for our food production.
- June 25th-WSIU Public Television came to visit and take some videos of Kids Korner to produce a snippet for their 4th of July special. The children were super excited to be on TV and picked some of our blackberries from our bush in the garden to provide an amazing advertisement for Kids Korner.

June 2021

Board Report

Superintendent of Recreation

- Continuation of land-based fitness programming to include Strength Training and Functional Fitness classes, Aikido, Karate, and Advanced Karate Classes
- Development of a monthly newsletter to detail the programs that are coming up
- Continued efforts to onboard two new full time recreation staff
- Over \$7,000 in revenue was acquired from program fees and facility rentals
- Over \$57,800 in revenue was generated from the Super Splash Park admissions, concessions, season passes, aquatics fitness classes, and swim lessons

Family Engagement

- Summer Daze mini camps were in full swing in June. The month began with “Tiny Chefs”, where students made different culinary creations. 16 different students were enrolled, averaging 10 per day. That was followed by “Disney camp”, with 15 students enrolled. “Wet and Wild” was next, where students participated in different water themed activities outside. 15 different students were enrolled. The month ended with “S.T.E.M.” where children put their brains to work building and conducting various experiments. 13 different students were enrolled, with 10 per day attending. All camps during the month of June were at full capacity with a waiting list.
- Virtual programming continued in June with an Ocean theme. Activities included ocean paintings and an “ocean in a bag”, along with various Ocean themed stories. The Super Splash Park video posted at the end of May also has received our largest number of views to date, with 550.

Aquatics & Athletics

- Since moving into phase 5, the Super Splash Park is open at 100% capacity.
- The leisure pool, lazy river, and slide reopened on June 24th after being closed for 10 days due to finding broken glass in the water.
- The Adult Learn-to-Swim program is in full swing teaching 7 adults to swim for free. Thank you, Saluki Masters Swimming!
- Session 1 of Learn-to-Swim and aquatic fitness classes have ended and session 2 begins July 12th. Most classes are full and some even have people on the waiting list.
- The Carbondale Cyclones have gained 13 new swimmers this month for a total of 97 swimmers. They hosted the first home meet of the year on June 24th and have 3 more scheduled for July including an invitational.
- Kassi taught 4 lifeguarding classes and trained over 15 new lifeguards.

Recreation & Outreach

- We have completed Swim Camp 1 & 2, Outdoor Adventure Camp 1, Farm to Table Camp 1, and Fun with STEM camps, respectively.
- During outdoor Adventure Camp the Campers were able to explore the Crab Orchard Harmony Trail, Castle Park, Mandala Garden, Evergreen Park, Attucks Park. Mandala Garden’s owner Gary was generous to donate the trip to us at no cost and gave everyone a small bundle of Lavender stems. The Crab Orchard National Refuge Wildlife Facility did a no Cost entrance to explore the Harmony trail for our Campers.
- During Farm to Table the campers explored Arrow Apiary Pure Honey, Country Sprouts Organics, Hallsberry Farms, SIU Greenhouse, and Neighborhood Coop.
- Fun With STEM took place at the LCC filled with different experiments, we did slime, playdough, Oobleck, the campers created aluminum boats, and did watercolor art with paper towels.

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS OF THE CARBONDALE PARK DISTRICT HELD MONDAY, JUNE 14, 2021 AT 5:30 PM VIA ZOOM ONLINE MEETING.

ROLL CALL: Upon Roll Call, the following Commissioners were present: Adams, Trimble, Flowers, and Sergeev. Commissioners Absent: Suarez. Staff present; Montgomery, Anderson, Burns, Melzer, Hoesman, and Legal Counsel, Mike Twomey. Staff Absent: None. Guests Present: No guests were present.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: It was moved by Commissioner Flowers and seconded by Commissioner Adams to approve the agenda as printed. Upon roll call vote the following Commissioners voted aye: Adams, Trimble, Flowers, and Sergeev. Commissioners Absent: Suarez. President Sergeev ordered the motion passed.

ACTION TAKEN: The agenda was approved as printed.

GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS: Commissioner Trimble announces that she will host an ice cream social at her residence on August 14th from 3:00-6:00 and adds that other desserts are welcome. Commissioner Flowers invites everyone to drop by Attucks Park this Saturday June 19th from 1:00-7:00 to join the Juneteenth Celebration sponsored by Southern Illinois Museum and Carbondale United and adds that the event will serve food and refreshments.

CITIZENS COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS: None.

REPORT OF PARK DISTRICT DIRECTOR AND DEPARTMENTAL HEADS:

Superintendents' Reports:

SUPERINTENDENT OF RECREATION: Recreation Superintendent Niki Hoesman reports:

- Continuation of in-person programming to include Land-Based fitness, Archery, Karate, and Ju-Jitsu
- Over \$21,800 in revenue was acquired from program fees, facility rentals, and Super Splash Park Passes
- Hired two new full-time recreation staff
- Planning for additional summer programming and fall programming is underway. We are hopeful to add programs such as play days in the park, family fitness opportunities, and outdoor family movie nights

Learning Tree

- Pre-k Learn and Play ended May 12, and Summer Daze mini camps began May 17th with "Nature Explorers". 7 children were enrolled, and students participated in Nature themed adventures and crafts. "Sports Stars" began May 24th with 9 children enrolled. Children played sports such as Soccer, T-Ball, Zumba, and Yoga using Park district facilities. The month concluded with "Music Camp" with 19 children enrolled. The highlight for the students was the "drum circle", where each child had their own 5-gallon bucket drum to play with drumsticks. Buckets were provided by the maintenance department.
- Children at the learning tree also planted, and have been maintaining, a flower garden in front of The Life Community Center.
- Staff set up a table at Unity Point's preschool family day on May 20th to promote the CPKD programs for young children.
- May was "Explore Your Community" month on our YouTube channel, with videos highlighting the Carbondale Public Library, the story hike at Oakland Nature Preserve, Campus Lake, and The Super Splash Park.

Aquatics

- We have hired a new Aquatics and Athletics Coordinator – Kassi Jones
- Super Splash Park summer schedules are complete to include aquatics fitness classes, learn to swim classes, and open lap swimming times
- We have begun renting the "Party Pad" for birthday parties and other celebrations
- Super Splash Park rules and regulations were reconfigured to consider COVID guidelines
- 84 kids have signed up for the Cyclones Swim Team for the 2021 season
- We opened the Super Splash Park on 5/31/21
- We've done two television interviews, to date, to advertise for our summer season

Recreation

- We have hired a new Recreation and Outreach Coordinator – Michelle Soto
- Our summer camp season has begun with nearly all the weeks full to capacity
- We have been able to award \$4000 dollars in scholarships to help pay for camp with tremendous gratitude to a private donor
- We developed new camper information forms and behavior code for camp kids

SUPERINTENDENT OF CHILDCARE: Superintendent Burns reports:

- Monday-Golfing at Hickory Ridge. The children absolutely loved riding in the golf carts and practicing their swings. Thank you to the golf crew for getting that together for us.
- Tuesday-Bowling at SI Bowl.
- Wednesday-Rolling Oak Alpaca Farms in Makanda.
- Thursday-Fish Tales in Herrin. The children were able to paint a ceramic piece which was then fired and returned. Then we went to Herrin park to play at their playgrounds.
- Friday-Project Human X. The children painted on canvas in a black lighted environment. It was a blast!

May 15th-Children returned to the hybrid learning schedule:

- Hours of Operation changed to:
 - M,T,Th,F-12:00PM-6:00PM
 - Wednesdays (full remote learning days) 7:30AM-6:00PM

May 16th-Katy Burns attended a webinar for the Childcare Restoration Grant. Fortunately, we received 3 more months of funding for January, February and March (80% of what we received in the first round).

May 19th-Had a meeting with the U of I Extension about our "Growing Together Illinois Garden Project"

- Kids Korner will be partnering with the U of I Extension to grow food for the Good Samaritan house here in Carbondale.
- The children will also be able to grow foods for our garden and cooking club.

May 25th-Katy Burns met with the For Kids' Sake group to partner together on a summer project for the For Kids' Sake art show. We are attempting to get a grant from the Carbondale Community Arts (CCA) to provide art workshops that will be held at different locations including some of the Carbondale Park District parks.

SUPERINTENDENT OF PARK MAINTENANCE: Superintendent Montgomery shares:

Super Splash Park-The crew manually vacuumed the competition pool and the lazy river. A new deepfreeze was installed in the concession area. Eric designed and installed a corral out of pvc pipe to store the inner tubes by the lazy river.
Kids Korner Eric replaced the hot water heater in the building.

Evergreen-The Restroom at the playground area was clogged and the crew had to router out the sewer line.

Superblock-The USSSA May Madness Baseball Tournament was held May 15th through May 16th. Number 1, 4, and the Boys Carbondale Middle School fields were used for play. The SIFC Force 3v3 Soccer Tournament was held at the Superblock fields on May 29. Carbondale Jr Sports ball had games and there were a few rain outs due to weather conditions.

Dear Kathy,

We typically reach out to you with great news about savings on electricity and natural gas rates we have secured on your behalf. While that is still the case overall, I feel we need to make sure you are aware of the recent issues in natural gas rates as a result of the February cold snap that crippled Texas and most of the Midwest. Over a 5-day period in February, the natural gas market experienced a phenomenon that has never been seen before. Pipelines froze, emergency days were called by many utilities, and the cold crippled the nation. Spot market prices for natural gas surged for during this 5-day period before falling back to pre-surge levels. Unfortunately, natural gas customers all over the US are being impacted by these dramatic short-term spikes. The reasons for the spike are complex and the avoidance of the effects of the price increases was virtually unavoidable by most. Your gas supplier, Constellation, sent a series of email notifications suggesting that there would be a potential impact felt unless there was complete shuttering of usage...and even that would not fully escape the price spikes. As a result, many of our customers are receiving bills that may be 6 times the normal monthly expenditure for the month of February.

AGE has worked with Constellation on several options to help our customers ease the pain of these short-term price spikes. Your AGE Energy Consultant, Bruce Wallace, will be reaching out to you to discuss these options. Options include spreading the balance out over a 12-month period. (insert name) would also like to discuss your "risk tolerance" of such events going forward. The option to fix a significant portion of your gas supply rate going forward exists, but historically, that has come at a hefty premium rate. Over the past few years, you are likely still money ahead being on a market-based index product versus the premium of a fixed natural gas rate.

We are equally frustrated with this issue but can assure you that this market event impacted customers across all suppliers, including Ameren Illinois customers. You may think the easy answer is to consider falling back to Ameren for natural gas supply. In fact, that decision could effectively cause you to pay for February's weather incident twice. A mistake we do not want to see you fall into. Ameren's approach for customers on default gas service is to increase its rates by nearly double for the foreseeable future until all their own losses are recovered. While our customers are seeing the impact all upfront, Constellation's willingness to spread those costs over an extended period is essentially the same process Ameren is taking.

Please look for a call from Bruce over the next week or two. He will walk you through the approved solutions we have agreed to for our customers.

We sincerely appreciate your trust in our commitment to bringing you data-based energy solutions and recommendations.

Board to vote on Kids Korner lease extension

CARBONDALE — The Carbondale Park District Board is expected to vote Monday to agree to a lease extension with the city for its Kids Korner daycare — giving the district time to find a new home for the program.

The lease for Kids Korner, near Turley Park, expired in 2013, though the park district has used the city-owned building as a child care facility in the years since. As the park district's finances have become more and more grim in recent decades, the district has expressed interest in reimagining its agreements with the city.

During its April 27 meeting, the Carbondale City Council agreed to send new lease terms to district officials who asked to

have its lease extended into 2022. District officials had asked for something similar last year.

After a lengthy and, at times, contentious debate last August, the two parties agreed to have their respective attorneys draft a lease that would give the park district access to the building on Glenview Drive until June 2021.

Outgoing Park District executive director Kathy Renfro said she was given some peace of mind in retiring this month knowing the debate over the Kids Korner property had reached a conclusion, at least temporarily.

"I'm grateful that the city council moved that forward," she said. "I feel relieved."

Park District Board President Carl Flowers said board

members hope to find a new location for Kids Korner, something they wanted to do sooner but COVID-19 restrictions hampered this effort.

He said this search might be coupled with finding a new home for its deteriorating LIFE Community Center.

Flowers said his dream would be to have Kids Korner housed in this new facility where there would also be a warm-water pool.

The district's LIFE Center on West Sunset Drive has been plagued with building problems — most recently it was discovered that the plumbing for the center's indoor pool was in need of significant repairs as well as the roof over that part of the building. A shrinking tax base with a growing list of services has drained the taxing body's bank accounts.

Members of Carbondale City Council expressed frustration and concern over the ask for another extension.

During the April 27 meeting, members said they did not want to put kids out or burden families at an already challenging time with the pandemic. However, they were also concerned that

the district appeared to be kicking the can down the road, again.

These tense conversations are not new. Discussion about the city and the park district combining forces in some way have been going for two years. In 2019, voters elected to have the council explore the city absorbing some of the district's operations as the CPKD's finances have prevented it from caring for some of its facilities. Carbondale Mayor Mike Henry has often been vocal about his distaste for the situation.

"How long are we going to subsidize the park district is my question. I don't know where the end is to this," Henry said during the April 27 meeting.

Lease documents provided by the city said rent for the Kids Korner building will be \$1 a month and that the district will be responsible for general maintenance of the building. There is also a clause that will allow the district to break the lease in the event of "catastrophic damages" to the facility that the district cannot afford to repair. The lease runs until Sept. 30, 2022.

The CPKD board will meet Monday at 5:30 p.m. and will vote on the terms of the lease then.

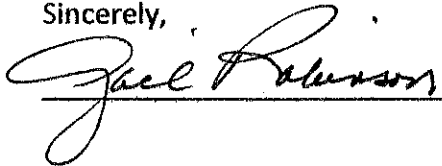

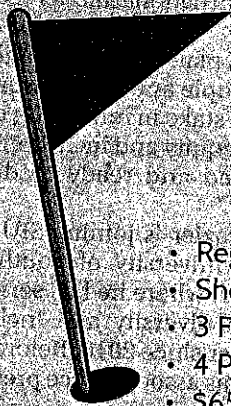

Reopening tests our resolve to defeat COVID

OUR VIEW

The state of Illinois has entered COVID-19 Phase 5, effectively opening without restrictions. It means we have made tremendous progress in treating people who were infected with COVID-19 and getting a significant percentage of people vaccinated — in fact, at least two-thirds of Illinoisans have received at least one dose. Reopening will undoubtedly boost the state economy and our collective spirits as we resume in-person activities and return to a sense of normalcy in our lives.

Still, I'm concerned about how the reopening will impact our most vulnerable communities, particularly the black and brown communities that we serve.

Unfortunately, there still remains a sizable amount of vaccine hesitancy, or as we in the community health space prefer to reference it, vaccine "questioning." According to the Illinois Department of Public Health, only 9 percent of black people and 13 percent of Latinos have been fully vaccinated in the state of Illinois. Early indicators have been showing a higher infection and death rates among people of color to less access, higher rates of preexisting conditions, higher percentages of front-line workers, and health inequities (i.e., disparities in access to health care). These factors are still true and now, vaccine questioning has also come into play and

could be a major factor in continued higher infection rates as we resume in-person, summer activities.

As an Illinois Public Health Association Pandemic Health Navigator Program (PHNP) supervisor, part of my role is to connect people to resources they need if they get infected. Resources such as access to food and medicine and assistance with utilities or rent if they've been out of work due to COVID-19 are among the support available under the Pandemic Navigator Health Program (HelpGuideIllive.org). The other part of my role is to inform and support people in making a plan to get vaccinated and ultimately getting the vaccine. This has proven more challenging.

In fact, my own 36-year-old son expressed reservations despite my en-

couragement to get vaccinated. He finally made the decision to get the vaccine to avoid being stigmatized at his worksite as not having been vaccinated. Yes, there is an enormous amount of misinformation, but the lack of trust in systems that have traditionally not been there for disadvantaged African Americans is real and we need to acknowledge it. We can't always assume concerns over vaccines comes from a lack of information, there is simply mistrust in that information.

So what can we do? I believe we must continue efforts to build trust and share our stories. When local community leaders, church leaders, community-based organizations, and our allies in

health care share their experience, we can learn from each other and dispel some of the myths around the vaccine.

Side effects, when they occur, are generally mild and temporary. The vaccine is not deadly. In fact, it can be a lifesaver, as it has proven effective in over

and spread, and it's not part of a larger conspiracy to infect us with something else. These are some of the myths we can prove wrong, but only with time, trust and sharing our stories. Further, we must make it as easy as possible for community members to get vaccinated. We need to schedule pop-up sites at events, community centers, restaurants, barber

Our goal, as the Pandemic Health Navigator team members, is to talk with as many people as possible and hopefully get a few shots in arms. This is our SHOT. Let's not miss our SHOT!

This Software as a Service Agreement ("Agreement") is made effective as of 11/13/2014 (the "Effective Date") and entered into between Active Network, LLC, 10182 Telesis Court, San Diego, CA 92121 ("Active" or "we" or "us") and Carbondale Park District ("you" or "your" or "Client"). The parties agree as follows:

1. **Services.** Active will provide services and support ("Services") related to events, camps, licenses, classes, tickets, contests, permits, facility/equipment use, transactions, sales, memberships, reservations, donations, and/or activities (together, "Events"), including without limitation access to its software as a solution product ("Software").
